

■ WAIROA RIVER PATHWAY

Wairoa is the main town of Northern Hawke's Bay and is the gateway to Lake Waikaremoana, and the wilderness of Te Urewera and Mahia Peninsula. Wairoa in Māori means 'Long Water' and is located on the banks of the expansive Wairoa River, which provides an excellent and sheltered venue for water-skiing, jet boating and rowing. The Wairoa i-SITE Visitor Centre is located on the corner of SH2 and Queen Street.

Experience some of Wairoa's rich heritage by exploring the 7.5 km (15km return) off road shared cycle/walkway beside the river and out to the wildlife lagoon. See sites of historical significance along the way, sharing the stories of Māori and European settlement. The ride starts at the historic Portland Island Lighthouse in town; it follows the river before heading up and over Pilot Hill, continuing beside Whakamahi Road to finish at Whakamahi Lagoon Wildlife Reserve.

The two Central Hawke's Bay trails both begin at Russell Park Waipukurau, and follow the stopbanks of the Tukituki River. Both trails are mostly flat, and the rural ride is naturally bordered by private farms and the river bank. The Northern trail is 12 km's and, at the junction of Tapairu Road, the large flat river bank area is a perfect spot for a picnic or a swim in summer. Riders can turn back to Russell Park or extend their ride down Tapairu Road leading into the town of Waipawa where it's easy to find a fantastic coffee or bite to eat.

The second, shorter ride also begins at Russell Park. The flat 2.5km stopbank track is excellent for younger family members to scooter or trike alongside other cyclists. The trail turn around brings riders back to Russell Park where there is a new playground area, and it's only a five minute walk, or two minute ride, into Waipukurau's main street.
